We are an **Open and Affirming** congregation and have been since 1993. This means we are committed to our affirmation and welcome of all people including lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, and queer folk. We are also a community that recognizes it is critical to do the hard work of **dismantling racism** in our lives and in our communities so all of God's beloved people can flourish.

We are inclusive in outlook, respecting other faiths and traditions as paths to God. We are aware of the joys and struggles of life, and to the causes and concerns of the world. Our spiritual lives are rooted in the practices of worship, prayer, and community-building, and those push us to seek justice, make peace, and love our neighbors and enemies. We also love to have fun, and music and laughter and the sharing of food are big parts of our lives together at Magnolia United Church of Christ.

Statement on Racism

Magnolia United Church of Christ recognizes the painful reality of racial violence, inequality and injustice being at a tipping point. We pledge to work toward needed changes in all of our national, regional, and local systems and within our own hearts, so this reckoning moment does not pass by as it has so many times in the past.

We call for racial equality not only within the law enforcement and the judicial systems, but also healthcare, economics, and education. A Greening Congregation

We are called to live in harmony with the environment, respecting and honoring the gifts of God's creation. As people of faith, we affirm that all of God's creation is sacred. As a community of faith, we engage in activities that protect God's creation and conserve resources. Our care for creation is expressed in many ways. Creation care is woven into elements of our worship, such as prayers, sermons, and music. A progressive and actively supported recycling initiative is carried out on several levels; recycling bins are everywhere, church facility users as well as members are encouraged to recycle, and use of paper products are discouraged. In addition, we are part of the Greening Congregations Program offered in partnership with Earth Ministry.

Worship

Worship is our steady heartbeat. Music old and new, readings from Scripture and poems from contemporary texts, people to support us, candlelight and music, sunlight, and silence. God is everywhere, but sometimes in the sacred space of the sanctuary, we have more of a chance to notice. We gather for worship at 10:00 am every Sunday in our beloved Sanctuary and also stream the service live on Facebook. Everyone is invited to participate as much or as little as comfort level allows; worship comes with no requirements about age, beliefs, membership, or baptism. We use inclusive language as we experience God as both Mother and Father, and also to acknowledge the equality of all people.

We invite children to be active participants in our worshipping community. All ages are welcome, especially babies. At the back of the sanctuary, there are children's welcome activity baskets to engage little hands and minds during the service time.

We celebrate **Communion** on the first Sunday of the month. We do this to remember the meal shared between Jesus Christ and his disciples. Communion Sunday means different things to different people, including rebirth, sustenance for life's journey, a recommitment to one's faith, and much more. At MUCC, the main thing to remember is we believe this is God's table where all people are welcome. We share grape juice and gluten-free bread.

Throughout the year, we will have special-themed services such as our **Blessing of the Animals** where we recognize all of God's creatures, **Ecumenical Thanksgiving Services** with other faith communities, **Domestic and Gender Violence Awareness** and **Mental Health Services** where we lift up our voices in the call for justice and compassion for all and, of course, contemplative, and joyous **Easter** and **Christmas Eve** services.

Music

Magnolia United Church of Christ views music as a key part of the worship experience. Many Sundays throughout the year, small groups of singers or instrumentalists provide musical offerings. The pianist-organist enriches worship with contemplative music and leads the congregation in hymns each week, both traditional and contemporary. The choir sings weekly except during the summer, drawing from a variety of styles: classical to contemporary, traditional to popular. Requests for favorites songs are welcomed. We have a choir that typically meets regularly for rehearsals Thursday evenings at 7:00 pm and Sunday mornings at 9:00 am.

The Sanctuary at MUCC is also an ideal location for concerts. Local and visiting ensembles have enjoyed the clear acoustics and have "borrowed" our piano and organ.

All the Ways Love Flows forth from our Community!

The Magnolia UCC Community has an incredible tradition of supporting our most vulnerable neighbors. Here's a bit of an overview of all of the ways that the MUCC generosity flows into our community and our world!

Monthly Giving Group Donations

Each month the MUCC Giving Group coordinates a special collection for a community organization that is serving our most vulnerable neighbors. We have collected for the Ballard Food Bank, Queen Anne Helpline, Byrd Barr Place, Food Banks in the Central District, Mary's Place and more! We try to coordinate with these agencies to fill a specific need that they are experiencing whether it be medical supplies for a clinic, weekend grocery bags for kids or personal care supplies for girls and women. Each month, you can find out what the donation focus is in our MailChimp's and in the monthly newsletter.

Annual Salmon Dinner

Each year, MUCC hosts an incredible Salmon Dinner where we don't just experience great food but also donate 100% of the proceeds to support targeted organizations. We typically raise over \$15,000, sending it out into the world to help both local, national, and international organizations.

Welcome Baskets for Interbay Village

Volunteers shop for and prepare welcome baskets for the new residents joining the community down at Interbay Village. Additionally, since 2015, we have advocated for this community of formerly homeless neighbors now living in tiny wooden houses. We provide meals, clothing, supplies, and help improve and maintain their buildings and grounds.

Mary's Place

As families transition from homelessness into permanent housing, we gather furniture and household supplies to welcome families into their new homes. We hold an annual underwear drive for bras, underwear and socks, helping the women of Mary's Place feel dignity when they receive comfortable wardrobe basics.

Service Sunday

Once a year instead of holding a church service, we are the church out in neighborhood. We coordinate with the larger community on service projects that include habitat restoration in local parks, blanket-making for those experiencing trauma, visiting the Seattle Animal Shelter, and assisting with the animals inside and projects outside, and packaging emergency supply bags for our homeless neighbors.

Pledging and Support at and for MUCC

There are many ways to support the beloved community at MUCC. That may come in the form of time (helping out on a project or a committee) or resources (making an annual pledge or a recurring donation). All are greatly appreciated!

If you are interested in offering some of your time and talents, MUCC has needs for folks to assist with Facilities coordination and projects, outdoor landscaping projects, monthly Communion preparation, serving as a Liturgist during Worship, coordinating with any of our partners on the monthly giving projects, leading a team for Service Sunday, helping with our Prayer Shawl Ministry, serving on the Coordinating Council (new insights are always welcome!) or some other way that hasn't been imagined! In regards to financial donations, annual pledging helps the church plan for the coming fiscal year. We usually have a Pledge Season that kicks off in October and try to have all pledges for the coming year in by the end of November. That allows our Treasurer and Council to plan financially for next year's projects. Those pledges cover salaries, utilities, musicians, and other expenses. When we know how much members and friends pledge for the next year, we can plan for a vibrant year of worship, music, education, and service. Pledges and other contributions cover more than half (55%) of our expenses.
